- faced with norm of univocal natio-ethno-cultural belongingness
- experiencing multiple natio-ethno-cultural belongingness
- and thus othering and discrimination

- other norms not challenged

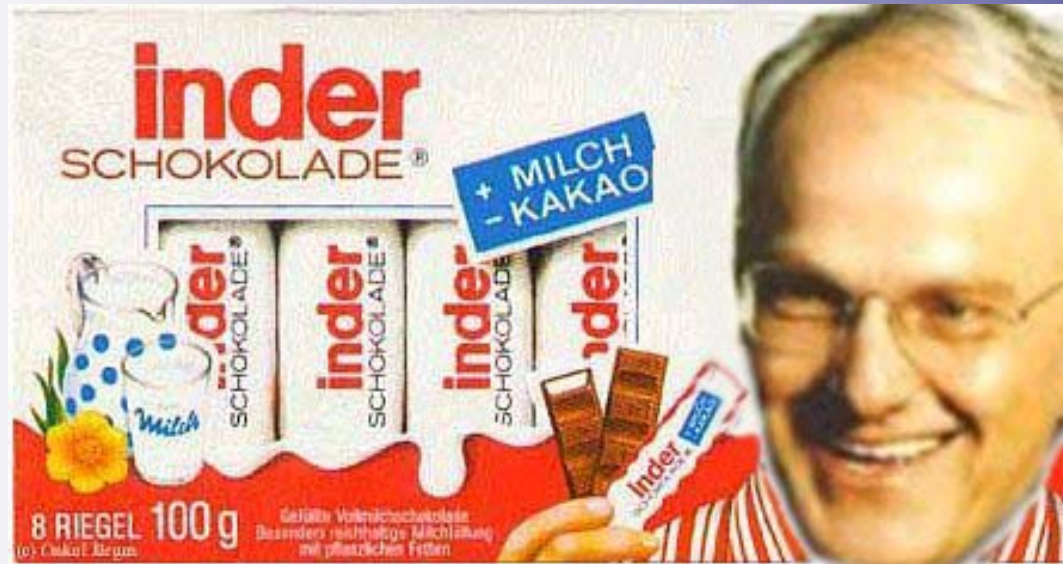
Functions
