Jenkins: Rethinking ethnicity

- Basic anthropological model:
 - about cultural differentiation
 - concerned with culture, rooted in social interaction
 - produced and reproduced, not fix
 - collective and individual, externalised and internalised

Jenkins: Rethinking ethnicity

problems:

- reification of groups
- focus on self-identification
- rethinking:
 - role of categorisation, also individually
 - role of power, compulsion, ressistance
 - racism
 - social construction of cultural differentiation and similarity
- ethnicity matters, imagined but not imaginary



May et al: Ethnicity

- dominance of constructivist accounts of ethnic identities
- aspect of social relationships
- no homogeneous groups
- overlapping social identities
- hybridity

May et al: criticism and challenges

- criticisms:
 - hybridity: based on essentialism
 - ethnicity: lack of choice, question of power
- challenges:
 - group-based rights without essentialising
 - world organised on ethnic basis



Brubaker: ethnicity without groups

- groupism: believe in
 - discrete, sharply differentiated, internally homogenous an externally bounded groups
 - as basic constituents of social life, chief protagonists of social conflicts, fundamental units of social analysis
- reification of groups
- ethnic commonsense: primordialism

Brubaker: ethnicity without groups

- 4. category is not a group
- 5. group-making as project
- 6. role of organisations
- 7. constituted through framing and coding
