Specifity of internet

- speed
- easy access and exit
- overcoming distance
- anonymity and freedom of expression
- contact with others like oneself
- control through moderators
- power of webmasters, question of legitimacy
- \rightarrow raising issues of security

Miller & Slater: theory

- (2000, 10-11)
- expansive realization:
 - enact a version of oneself or culture
 - that is regarded as old or even originary
 - but could not be realised so far
 - i.e. "one can become what one thinks one really is"
- expansive potential:
 - envisage a quite novel vision of what one could be
